### Not Changing Financial Priorities...

2. I start \_\_\_\_\_ to what I \_\_\_\_\_ with my money.

### Changing My Financial Priorities Means:

3. I start putting \_\_\_\_\_ away \_\_\_\_\_.

The wise man saves for the future, but the foolish man spends whatever he gets. (Proverbs 21:20, TLB)

He who gathers money little by little makes it grow. (Proverbs 13:11b, NIV)

4. I start \_\_\_\_\_ out of \_\_\_\_\_.

The rich rule over the poor, and the borrower is servant to the lender.  
(Proverbs 22:7, NIV)

5. I become \_\_\_\_\_ with \_\_\_\_\_.

Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the first fruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing, and your vats will brim over with new wine. (Proverbs 3:9-10, NIV)

A generous man will himself be blessed, for he shares his food with the poor. (Proverbs 22:9, NIV)

"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house. Test Me in this, and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of Heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it." (Malachi 3:10, NIV)

### 10-10-80 Principle:

- First 10% goes to God
- Second 10% goes to me (savings)
- Remaining 80% is what I live on
