About bitterness:

- 1. Bitterness has a <u>dangerous</u> root.
- 2. Bitterness produces a <u>poisonous fruit.</u>

Qualities of bitter people:

- 1. Bitter people justify their bitterness.
- 2. Bitter people tend to become <u>overly</u> <u>critical</u>.
- 3. Bitter people secretly <u>celebrate</u> the <u>misfortunes</u> of <u>others</u>.
- 4. Bitter people tend to <u>write off</u> entire groups of <u>people</u>.
- 5. Bitter people <u>struggle</u> to see <u>bitterness</u> in the <u>mirror</u>.



I kill the <u>root</u> of bitterness with <u>forgiveness</u>.

Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you. (Ephesians 4:31-32, NIV)



...is not <u>easy</u>.

...is not <u>natural</u>.

...is not <u>denial</u>.

...is not a <u>one-time</u> <u>event</u>.

...does not necessarily <u>resume</u> a <u>relationship</u>.
